This information is collected and will be used subject to the *Information Act 2002*, for the purposes of assisting the Chief Health Officer to exercise powers and perform functions to prevent or control the spread of a notifiable disease under the *Public and Environmental Health Act 2011*, namely the novel coronavirus COVID-19.

# Who is exempt from the requirement to quarantine?

**If your application has not been received and approved by the time you arrive in the Northern Territory you must begin the mandatory 14 days of self-quarantine until your application is approved.**

## Exempt person

In accordance with the *Public and Environmental Health Act 2011* (the Act) Chief Health Officer's Directions (COVID-19 Directions 2020), essential persons are defined under the following criteria:

### 1. Security and Governance

- a. Active Australian military personnel required to be on duty in the Northern Territory.
- b. A member of the Commonwealth Parliament who is ordinarily resident in the Northern Territory and who practises social distancing measures while in the Territory.

### 2. Health Services

- a. A health practitioner, as listed in the Chief Health Officer Directions, who is requested by the Chief Executive Officer of the Department of Health to come to the Northern Territory to perform functions.

### 3. Transport, freight and logistics

- a. Any person providing services for the transport or freight of goods and related logistics into, within and out of the Territory, as listed in the Chief Health Officer Directions.
- b. A member of the crew of a ship that is delivering persons, transporting goods or providing related logistics into, within and out of the Territory, as listed in the Chief Health Officer Directions.
- c. A member of a flight crew as listed in the Chief Health Officer Directions.

### 4. Specialist skills critical to maintaining key industries or businesses

- a. A specialist required to provide services needed for the continuity of industry or business and the maintenance of competitive operations if:
  - i. the specialist's skills are not available in the Northern Territory; and
  - ii. the service must be provided without delay; and
  - iii. the specialist must be physically present in the Northern Territory to provide the service; and
  - iv. the specialist practises social distancing measures while in the Northern Territory;

- b. A person responsible for the necessary maintenance or repair of power, water, communications and other infrastructure critical to the Territory, if the person practises social distancing measures while in the Territory.

### 5. An emergency service worker

- a. A law enforcement officer or emergency service worker who is requested to assist the Territory, or required to enter the Territory, while performing their official duties, if the officer or worker practices social distancing measures while in the Territory.
- b. A person required for the administration of justice in the Northern Territory.
- c. A paramedic, an officer of St John Ambulance Australia (NT) Inc. or a member of the crew of Careflight or the Royal Flying Doctor Service who is providing medical transport to a person or returning to the Northern Territory as soon as was practicable after providing medical transport to a person.
- d. A paramedic or an officer of St John Ambulance Australia (NT) Inc. who is ordinarily resident in the Northern Territory and who is requested by the Chief Executive Officer of St John Ambulance Australia (NT) Inc. to return to perform functions in the Territory.

## Other exemptions

- a. A person who arrives on a flight and does not leave the airport before leaving the Northern Territory on a flight.
- b. A person or class of persons is exempt, as listed in the Chief Health Officer Directions, if the Chief Health Officer has granted the person or class an exemption from that direction, in writing, on the grounds that the person or class:
  - i. is essential for the proper functioning of the Northern Territory; or
  - ii. needs an exemption to avoid unusual, undeserved or disproportionate hardship; or
  - iii. is governed by a COVID-19 management plan, imposed by the employer of the person or class of persons, to prevent the transmission of COVID-19.

#### Example for ii

*A person in Avon Downs or another place close to the border may need to move across the border to obtain critical goods and services.*

#### Example for iii

*An employee of a commercial fishing, mining, energy or agricultural business that has a plan, approved by the Chief Health Officer, on managing transmission of COVID-19 among its employees and preventing its transmission to the community.*
